- Dublin dog licences, 1923–24. This list contains the names and addresses of about 700 residents in the greater Swords area in 1923–24. It covers Swords, Malahide, Donabate and parts of rural Fingal, and as well as the names of the dog owners, they also provide an insight into various townland names.
