Since our last newsletter we have uploaded the following records to our database at www.rootsireland.ie:

- County Cork (Diocese of Kerry): 1,806 Dromtariffe Roman Catholic marriages dating from 1832-99.
- County Limerick: 36,313 records, including Roman Catholic baptisms and marriages and various census substitutes.

Over 166,000 records from Galway, Clare, Westmeath, Kerry, Armagh, Antrim, Down, Kilkenny, Tipperary and Monaghan were added to the Roots Ireland database in 2022, with many more to come in 2023!

NEW SEARCH FEATURE ON ROOTS IRELAND!



We are delighted to announce a new search feature on the Roots Ireland website! This Full Text Search allows you to search for words which appear in the various records (barring standard surnames). This means that occupations, legitimacy and other information may be searched for throughout the database, opening up an incredible amount of detail not previously searchable.

- In order to access this exciting feature, you must select a county (it will not function in anything more than a one county search), click on 'Search', then select 'Full Text Search'. Any records with the words you search for will come up. This is a great tool for researchers, students and academics, or simply those interested in whiling away some time. Get searching!

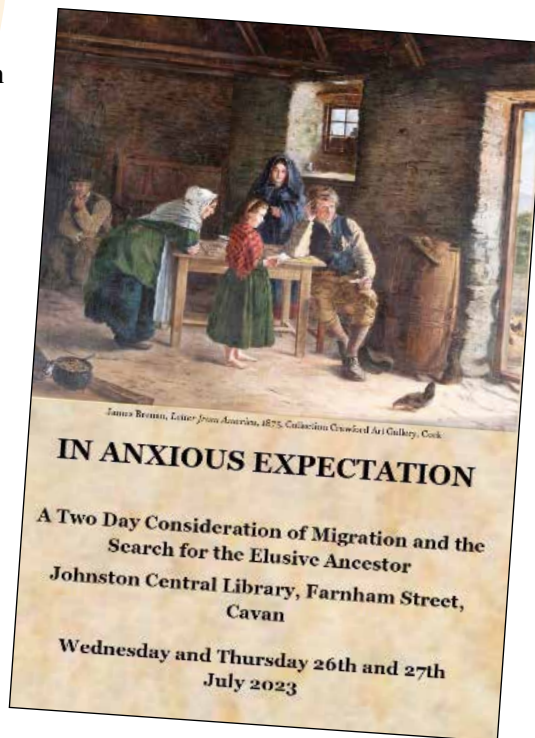

CAVAN CALLING

Cavan Calling, the global homecoming festival for the Cavan Diaspora, will take place from 26th to 30th July 2023 here in County Cavan, with the global Cavan family coming together for a four-day celebration of the county, its people, culture, heritage, landscape, sport, and the achievements of its Diaspora.

Cavan people living at home and overseas, those with Cavan ancestry, and those with an affinity for the Breffni County, are invited to answer Cavan's call and join in the celebrations.

As part of this celebration, Cavan Genealogy and the Mellon Centre for Migration Studies,



Omagh, are running in the Johnston Central Library, Cavan, on 26-27 July, a two-day conference entitled 'In anxious expectation', which deals with migration and the search for the elusive ancestor.
